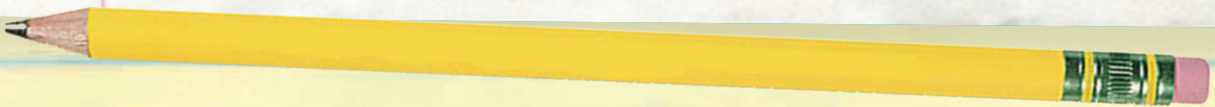

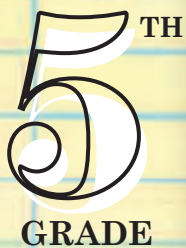

Concerts for Clock Hours

Attend a Wyckoff Masterworks Season concert with a Pre-concert Talk one hour prior to performance for 3 clock hours through the Washington Music Educators Association (WMEA). Sign-in sheet and registration information are available at the Head Usher Station in Benaroya Hall's Grand Lobby.



Open Rehearsals — Designed for secondary school students

In these working sessions, students will observe professional rehearsal techniques – the ways in which the conductor and musicians bring the music to life! Students are given an introduction to the acoustics of the S. Mark Taper Foundation Auditorium at Benaroya Hall, the requirements of the score and information about the composers. During the Orchestra's break, a Symphony musician will meet with the students for a brief question-and-answer session (EALRs 1.1, 1.3, 1.4, 2.3, 3.3, 4.5).

Fee: First visit is free with an annual *Soundbridge* school membership (\$75); subsequent visits are \$2 per student (capped at \$75). Seattle Symphony does not cover transportation costs.
